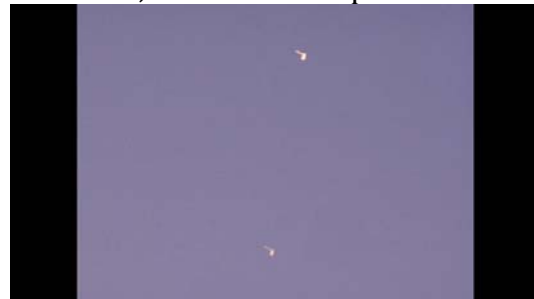

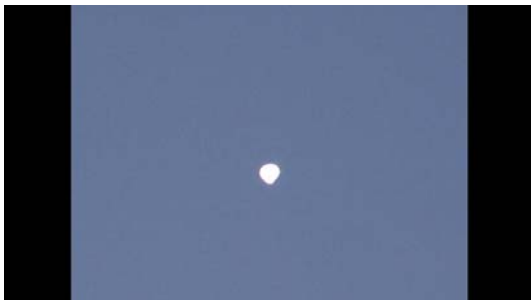

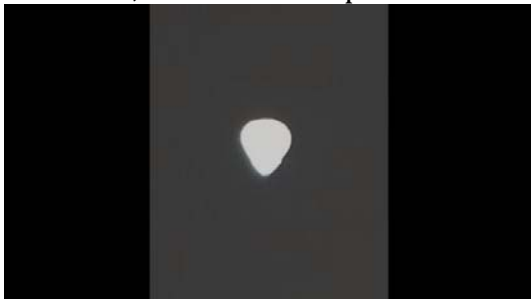

Jacoby Jennings personal account of the occurrence:

I and several witnesses were in a grocery store parking lot on Saturday October 17, 2009 at around 7:15 pm

when everyone began noticing a large bluish lit oval light. It was stationary and did not change vertical or horizontal position for the length of the sighting which lasted around 10 minutes.

As everyone in the parking lot began to stop and look up at the sky I parked my car and rolled down the window to get a clear view of the object. I assumed it was a weather balloon at first glance, but then began to notice there was something off about this object. It did not move at ALL. It was if almost as if it were frozen in position. I also thought the sun was reflecting off of it to light it, but as the sun began to go down the object got even brighter blue in intensity. There was not a cloud in the sky and there was no noise generated from the object.

Then it happened. I was so transfixed on this object I was afraid to blink. As it stay fixed in its position in the sky a red light began to lower from underneath the blue object. It lowered slowly as if tethered to the object above. The red light lowered for about 6 or 7 seconds then the larger blue object above it began to glow red as well. The two lights were directly lined up about 50 feet apart vertically. THEN the lower red light began to ascend as the object above it moved west....now the 2 lights were 50 feet apart horizontally still in the same height in the sky. Then the red light on the right continued to ascend until out of view. The other main red light stayed in the same place until becoming so small it could not be seen. This all happened before dark. I could not believe what I had just seen. Of course the local news outlets reported it a NASA weather balloon. Which I'm fine with.as long as they can prove to me that a weather balloon is capable of everything I saw it do.
